I do not make specific recomendations, other than suggesting 2 or 4 year schools depending on students' academic and financial status.

I do not pre-select colleges for my students

I do not really recommend. I expose and explain choices. Most students/parents are about U.C. system and private colleges. e.g. Stanford, Princeton, Yale..etc Out-of-State 1st Colorado 2cnd Oregon

I Do Not Recommend

I do not recommend any specific colleges.

I do not recommend at all.

I do not recommend colleges to my AP students unless personally asked.

I do not recommend colleges to my students- but I do comment on their selections.

I do not recommend colleges to students. We look at what their major goals & needs are & then I make suggestions & send them out to look. I might suggest Warner Pacific in one incident, UO, another.

I do not recommend institutions by name.

I do not recommend schools. I help students choose a list of schools to research. Every student creates a different list.

I do not recommend specific colleges. I encourage them to compare their interests and financial situation with what colleges have to offer.

I do not specifically recommend any one college.-We look at many-

I do NOT specifically recommend certain colleges to students

I don't - let them make those choices

I don't have a preference

I don't list any until I've listened to the student.

I don't make specific rec's - I discuss what I know about schools.

I don't really do this

I don't really recommend.

I don't really recommend. I provide information

I don't recommend any unless asked. I do tell them that Portland Comm. Coll. and Portland State have good programs.

I don't recommend any, I encourage them to research where they are going to go and then discuss their considerations they are making.

I don't recommend colleges or universities

I don't recommend specific ones but discuss the fact that they meet the Un. of Cal. requirements they will be eligible for any place they want to go. I do recommend that they apply to at least one UC.

I don't recommend, I offer advice is asked about specific institutions.

I don't recommend. I only advise that student parent look for themselves.

I don't recommend. I recommend they collect and process information. I help.

I don't recommend. I send students to resourses that will help them make a decision on colleges.

I don't recommend-their needs are all different. Lately I definitely emphasize privates & out of state and then CA.

I leave the recommendations up to the college guidance counselor. She's excellent at matching students' needs & goals with schools.

I let them choose

I make recommendations after THEIR choice. Stanford Brown

I merely WORK with their choices and discuss. I usually discourage attendance at U of O when possible.

I never recommend colleges though occasionally students or parents have discussed the choices they are making and asked for my observations.

I rarely do this.

I really don't recommend any. I work with the students on their choices of colleges.

I really don't recommend colleges. I leave that up to the students.

I recomend the following because the students DON'T know them: Rice, Macalester, Grinnell, Union, Washington & Lee. The local and other more popular schools they know.

I recommend colleges based om students appitudes interests & needs - Not by college Name!

I recommend State Colleges: U of O & OSU, U of Puget Sound, U of Washington, Whitman, Willamatte & Linfield: mostly Oregon colleges

I recommend to my students to choose the college that suits them best

I recommend to those students who aren't sure what they want to do, that they look into a comm. college.

I recommended all 4 year colleges/universities in Oregon, Washington, adn Idaho.

I teach A.P. I never recommend. Students come to me to write recommendations to particular colleges/universities. I have recommended the U of O on several occasions.

I tell students that a college experience is worthwhile almost anywhere.

I tell the students to apply to one State College, one private college & one community college in state! I tell them to apply to two colleges outside the state so that they can have some choice where to go!

I try to recommend the college or university most appropriate for the student's interests and financial ability to pay. It's hard to say.

I use Peterson's Computer Program- students choose colleges based on major, geographic location and academic standing most frequently- Final cost is also a factor as is size.

I usually don't make recommendations

I usually don't recommend a school. We discuss pros and cons, strengths and weaknesses of both school and student.

Impossible to answer because it depends on the students' college profile!!

Impossible to limit to 3-5. It depends on the student's abilities and personality. We try to match students to institutions.

It DEFINITELY is NOT a counselor's place to recommend specific schools. The guidance is how to select.

It depends entirely on their individual needs

It depends on the student- for value, an in-state public institution is good. For those who like small, a private one is best.

It depends on the student. I recommend the colleges that will best fit with the student's interests and goals. It depends on their career goals - money etc.

It depends upon the student and his/her priorities. The U. of O. is certianly one consistently recommended It varies so much with the students and their objectives. Out of 31 students this year. I have students going to Smith, EOSC, Duquesne, Purdue, Cogswell, Ariz. State, Concordia (Ptld), Concordia (Seward, NE), PLU, etc. The most common are WOSC, Concordia (Ptld), PLU, U of O.
