

The Office of Student Life is conducting this survey to assess and document any changes in the social climate on campus for gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender (GLBT) faculty, staff, and students. This information is essential not only to the university's Standing Committee for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual Issues, but also to campus agencies that provide services to faculty, staff, and students.

It is important that all people who receive the survey respond, regardless of sexual orientation, in order to ensure adequate representation. Survey topics related to GLBT issues include: campus climate; events, courses, workshops and lectures; harassment and discrimination; and suggestions for making campus a more friendly environment for GLBTs on campus. Because the survey questions can be personal or sensitive in nature, your answers and comments are strictly anonymous and voluntary. There is no way to identify who completed a particular questionnaire. All results will be reported in aggregate form only.

If you wish to comment upon questions or qualify any answers, please feel free to write in the margins. Your comments will be read and taken into account. Please contribute to our understanding of the kind of environment which exists for people whose sexual orientation places them in a minority on campus.
