# COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AMENDMENT 001-14: DAVIS ROAD AND 185<sup>TH</sup> AVENUE INTERCHANGE REFINEMENT AREA TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM PLAN AMENDMENTS

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN ORDINANCE NO. 2793, AS AMENDED, AND THE TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM PLAN UPDATE (JANUARY 2004) AS AMENDED, TO INCLUDE PLANNED EXTENSIONS OF SE DAVIS ROAD AS A PLANNED COLLECTOR STREET AND THE ADDITION OF THE 185<sup>th</sup> INTERCHANGE REFINEMENT AREA.

WHEREAS, recent development and the need for increased transportation network connectivity has necessitated street extension SE Davis Rd as a planned collector street and the addition of the 185<sup>th</sup> Ave Interchange Refinement Area in the Transportation System Plan; and

WHEREAS, the identified transportation facilities will require changes in multiple tables and figures in the following plans:

#### Transportation System Plan

- Amending text in Tables 4-7, 4-10, 4-11, 4-13 and 4-14 to reclassify and update information for the extension SE Davis Rd.
- Amending Transportation System Plan maps in Figures 1-2, 1-3, 1-5, 1-6, 1-8 and I-9 to create new alignments for the extension SE Davis Rd and to delineate the 185<sup>th</sup> Interchange Refinement Area.

#### Comprehensive Plan

Amending Figures 13-5 in Section 13 Transportation and Figures 14-1, 14-1A.
 14-2, 14-4, 14-6, and I4-7 in Section 14 Comprehensive Plan Maps to reflect the changes to the Transportation System Plan regarding the new alignments for the extension of SE Davis Rd and to delineate the 185<sup>th</sup> Ave Interchange Refinement Area.

WHEREAS, the Transportation System Plan is a planning document which is incorporated into the Comprehensive Plan in its entirety by reference and any amendment or modification of the Transportation System Plan requires the City to follow the appropriate plan amendment process outlined in Section 1 of the Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, Comprehensive Plan Section 1 (IV) sets for the procedures and criteria for minor Comprehensive Plan changes; and

WHEREAS, on March 26, 2014 the Planning Commission approved Order No. 8111 initiating this amendment; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission conducted public hearings on this matter on April 23, May 14, and May 28, 2014. The Commission heard testimony in opposition to the extension of Brogden and directed City staff to conduct analysis of additional options within that corridor and to proceed with the amendment process for the Davis extension and 185<sup>th</sup> Ave Interchange Refinement Area; and

WHEREAS, on June 4, 2014, based on the record and Exhibits A and B attached hereto, the Planning Commission recommended City Council approval of the Transportation System Plan and Hillsboro Comprehensive Plan amendments to extend SE Davis Rd as a planned collector and to delineate the 185<sup>th</sup> Ave Interchange Refinement Area through adoption of Order No. 8115; and

WHEREAS, the City Council considered the Planning Commission's recommendation at its regular meeting on July 1, 2014.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF HILLSBORO ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. As set forth in Exhibit A and based upon the findings of fact in Exhibit B, the City Council approves the amendments to the Comprehensive Plan and Transportation System Plan to extend SE Davis Rd as a planned collector and to delineate the 185<sup>th</sup> Interchange Refinement Area, as contained in Case File No. Comprehensive Plan Amendment 001-14: Davis Rd and 185<sup>th</sup> Ave Interchange Refinement Area.

Section 2. Except as herein amended, Comprehensive Plan Ordinance No. 2793, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be effective from and after 30 days following its passage and approval by the Mayor.

Second approval and adoption by the Council on this 15th day of July 2014.

#### Comprehensive Plan Amendment HCP 001-14: Davis Road and 185<sup>th</sup> Avenue Interchange Refinement Area Transportation System Plan Amendments

#### Text Amendments:

The first text amendment is to the Bicycle Master Plan to reflect the standard facilities that are present on Collector streets.






Several TSP and Comprehensive Plan Maps will be amended to reflect the extension of Davis as well as the 185<sup>th</sup> Interchange Refinement Area. The figures showing the amendment are attached to this Exhibit. The following are the changes on each figure:


- TSP Figure 1-2 Pedestrian Master Plan. Figure 1-2 will be amended by adding the planned sidewalks on collectors line along the planned alignment of Davis.
- TSP Figure 1-3 Bicycle Master Plan. Figure 1-3 will be amended by adding the planned bike lane on collectors line along the planned alignment and Davis.
- TSP Figure 1-5 Street Improvement Plan. Figure 1-5 will be amended by denoting 3 lanes along the proposed alignment of Davis, and there will be a box denoting the rough boundary of the U.S. 26/185<sup>th</sup> Interchange Refinement Area.
- TSP Figure 1-6 Future Streets Where Right of Way is Planned for Two or More Lanes. CITY OF HILLSBORO CASE FILE NO. HCP 001-14 FINDINGS OF FACT

#### NATURE OF AMENDMENTS

This is a legislative amendment to the Hillsboro Comprehensive Plan (HCP) Ordinance No. 2793, as amended and the City of Hillsboro Transportation System Plan (TSP) Update, January 2004, to amend text and maps to implement planned transportation improvements for extension of SE Davis Rd to be classified as a Collector and to designate the 185<sup>th</sup> Avenue Interchange Refinement Area. The amendments were initiated by the Planning Commission through adoption of Order No. 8111. The proposed amendments are legislative in nature, therefore the governing procedures for the amendment are found in Comprehensive Plan Section 1(IV) (A) and the 120 day rule does not apply. Preparation and adoption of Comprehensive Plan Amendment 001-14 must comply with the Minor Plan Text Amendment Procedural requirements set forth by Section 1 of the Hillsboro Comprehensive Plan.

The purpose of the amendment is to classify an extension of SE Davis Rd west of its current terminus at SE River Rd to be classified as a Collector street and the addition of the "185<sup>th</sup> Interchange Refinement Area" where NW Stucki Ave or NW 194<sup>th</sup> Ter would tie into the existing interchange of NW 185<sup>th</sup> Ave and U.S. 26 in a configuration to be determined. The extension of SE Davis Rd would improve street connectivity and ensure more efficient and safer circulation for travel throughout the City. The 185<sup>th</sup> Ave Interchange Refinement Area would represent the beginning of analysis and discussion of ways to improve access to the 185<sup>th</sup> Ave interchange on U.S. 26 and circulation within the Tanasbourne area of the City.

#### **HEARINGS**

The Planning Commission held a public hearing and considered these amendments at its meetings on April 23, May 14, and May 28, 2014.

#### MINOR PLAN AMENDMENT FINDINGS

(IV) Minor Plan Amendments.

Page 1 of 5 Exhibit B

#### (A) Minor Plan Amendment: Plan Text.

(1) On its own volition, the City Council or Planning Commission may initiate a minor plan amendment to the text of the Comprehensive Plan by order whenever a need for such a revision is documented. A minor plan amendment, proposing a change to the text of the Comprehensive Plan, shall be processed pursuant to legislative notice and procedures. (Amended by Ord. No. 5891/12-08.)

Finding: The Planning Commission approved Order No. 8111 on March 26, 2014 which initiated the minor plan amendment legislative process.

(2) Notice of any public hearing on a minor plan amendment to the Comprehensive Plan text shall be by two (2) publications in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Hillsboro not less than five (5) days, nor more than twenty (20) days prior to the date of the hearing.

Finding: Planning Department Staff published the notice of the proposed amendments in the April 9<sup>th</sup> and April 16<sup>th</sup> editions of the Forest Grove News-Times and the April 11<sup>th</sup> and April 18<sup>th</sup> editions of the Hillsboro Tribune.

#### (C) Minor Plan Amendment - General Procedures.

(1) A public hearing shall be held by the Planning Commission on any minor plan amendment.

Finding: The Planning Commission held a hearing on the minor plan amendment on April 23, May 14 and May 28, 2014.

(2) Recess of hearing. The Planning Commission may recess a hearing in order to obtain further information or provide additional notification. Upon recessing for these purposes, the Commission shall announce the time and date when the hearing will be resumed.

Finding: The Planning Commission did not request to recess the hearing; therefore this is not applicable.

(3) After hearing the proposed minor plan amendment, the Planning Commission shall deny or forward a recommendation of approval or approval with modifications to the City Council.

Finding: The Planning Commission approved Order No. 8113 recommending approval of the amendments to City Council.

(4) Any party to a proceeding on a minor plan amendment may appeal the recommendation on the amendment of the Planning Commission to the City Council by filing such an appeal with the City Recorder within fifteen (15) days of the mailing date of the Planning Commission's Notice of Decision on the amendment.

Finding: It is unknown at this time if any party to the proceeding intends to appeal the recommendation on the amendment of the Planning Commission to the City Council.

(5) The City Council may hold a hearing on the proposed minor plan amendment. The Council shall hold a hearing on any appeal of a Planning Commission decision on a minor plan amendment. If a public hearing is held, notice for such a hearing shall comply with the applicable notice requirements relating to minor amendments to the Plan text or to the Plan Map as set forth above. After consideration of a proposal or an appeal, the City Council may adopt or deny the minor plan amendment or uphold, reject or modify the recommendation of the Planning Commission.

Finding: It is unknown at this time if the City Council intends to hold a hearing on the proposed minor plan amendment.

(6) The applicant shall be notified in writing of the City Council decision.

Finding: This is a City-initiated legislative plan amendment; therefore, there is no applicant.

(7) The Planning Department shall keep copies of the adopted minor plan amendment on file at City Hall and the City Library for inspection by the public and shall notify citizens and government agencies who have requested notice that copies of the adopted amendments are available for inspection.

Finding: The Planning Department shall keep copies of the adopted minor plan amendment on file at City Hall and the City Library for inspection by the public and shall notify citizens and government agencies who have requested notice that copies of the adopted amendments are available for inspection.

(8) The Planning Commission shall also establish and publicize a procedure whereby interested individuals, community

organizations and public agencies may request to be included on a regular mailing list of parties to be notified of the initiation of proposed minor plan amendments.

Finding: This is not applicable to the plan amendment process.

#### TRANSPORTATION PLANNING RULE (TPR) FINDINGS

The following findings are intended to address the applicable sections of the Oregon Transportation Planning Rule – Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR) 660-012-0060. The Planning Commission finds that the proposed amendments to the Transportation System Plan, a component of the Comprehensive Plan, are in compliance with the Oregon Transportation Planning Rule.

#### OAR 660-012-0060 requires the following:

- (1) If an amendment to a functional plan, an acknowledged comprehensive plan, or a land use regulation (including a zoning map) would significantly affect an existing or planned transportation facility, then the local government must put in place measures as provided in section (2) of this rule, unless the amendment is allowed under section (3), (9) or (10) of this rule. A plan or land use regulation amendment significantly affects a transportation facility if it would:
  - (a) Change the functional classification of an existing or planned transportation facility (exclusive of correction of map errors in an adopted plan);

Finding: Staff finds the planned extensions of SE Davis Rd as a Collector street and the addition of the 185<sup>th</sup> Ave Interchange Refinement Area will create a significant effect on the transportation system, as defined in OAR 660-012-0060(1)(a) by adding new street connections where there are currently none, thereby increasing the transportation network connectivity and functionality in the vicinity of the proposed street extension.

The 185<sup>th</sup> Ave Interchange Refinement Area is a generalized overlay and not a functional classification, however future study and planning of the area may result in new street connections or changes to functional classifications. As such, the 185<sup>th</sup> Ave Interchange Refinement Area does not significantly affect an existing or planned facility since the proposal does not include new roadways, or changes to classification of existing roadways. Upon further study within the 185<sup>th</sup> Ave Interchange Refinement Area, compliance with the Transportation Planning Rule will be re-examined if a determination is made that additional roadways or reclassification of existing roadways is needed.

(2) If a local government determines that there would be a significant effect, then the local government must ensure that allowed land uses are consistent with the identified function, capacity, and performance standards of the facility measured at the end of the planning period identified in the adopted TSP through one or a combination of the remedies listed in (a) through (e) below, unless the amendment meets the balancing test in subsection (2)(e) of this section or qualifies for partial mitigation in section (11) of this rule. A local

government using subsection (2)(e), section (3), section (10) or section (11) to approve an amendment recognizes that additional motor vehicle traffic congestion may result and that other facility providers would not be expected to provide additional capacity for motor vehicles in response to this congestion.

(c) Amending the TSP to modify the planned function, capacity or performance standards of the transportation facility.

Finding: Staff finds that by adding the extension of SE Davis Rd will better serve the anticipated growth and its subsequent traffic demands and allows the City's larger transportation network to function in a more effective manner. The Collector street classification will allow the planned roadways to provide increased capacity, performance and safety over the smaller Neighborhood Route and Local street designations. The increased network connectivity will relieve capacity and functionality on other surrounding facilities.

- Amending Transportation System Plan maps in Figures 1-2, 1-3, 1-5, 1-6, 1-8 and 1-9 to create new alignments for the extension SE Davis Rd and to delineate the 185<sup>th</sup> Interchange Refinement Area.

#### Comprehensive Plan

Amending Figures 13-5 in Section 13 Transportation and Figures 14-1, 14-1A, 14-2, 14-4, 14-6, and 14-7 in Section 14 Comprehensive Plan Maps to reflect the changes to the Transportation System Plan regarding the new alignments for the extension of SE Davis Rd and to delineate the 185<sup>th</sup> Ave Interchange Refinement Area.

WHEREAS, the Transportation System Plan is a planning document which is incorporated into the Comprehensive Plan in its entirety by reference and any amendment or modification of the Transportation System Plan requires the City to follow the appropriate plan amendment process outlined in Section 1 of the Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, Comprehensive Plan Section 1 (TV) sets for the procedures and criteria for minor Comprehensive Plan changes; and

WHEREAS, on March 26, 2014 the Planning Commission approved Order No. 8111 initiating this amendment; and

Page 1 of 2 Order No. 8115 Planning Commission WHEREAS, City staff have identified a need for the extension of Davis, to be classified as a collector street, to improve city wide connectivity, to relieve traffic on surrounding roadway systems and better accommodate current and future planned development; and

WHEREAS, City staff have identified street system connectivity deficiencies within the vicinity of the 185<sup>th</sup> Aven interchange with U.S. 26 and the need for an interchange refinement study area to further determine future connections to the interchange; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission conducted public hearings on this matter on April 23, May 14, and May 28, 2014. The Commission heard testimony in opposition to the extension of Brogden and directed City staff to conduct analysis of additional options within that corridor; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission hereby favors amending the Transportation System Plan and Hillsboro Comprehensive Plan to extend SE Davis Rd as a planned collector and to delineate the 185<sup>th</sup> Ave Interchange Refinement Area based on the Staff Report dated June 4, 2014 attached hereto as Exhibit A and Findings attached hereto as Exhibit B.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF HILLSBORO PLANNING COMMISSION ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Based on the testimony and the record, the Planning Commission recommends that the City Council approve the amendments to the Comprehensive Plan and Transportation System Plan to extend SE Davis Rd as a planned collector and to delineate the 185<sup>th</sup> Interchange Refinement Area, as contained in Case File No. Comprehensive Plan Amendment 001-14: Davis Rd and 185<sup>th</sup> Ave Interchange Refinement Area.

Section 2. The Planning Commission adopts the staff report dated June 4, 2014 and its attachments as Exhibit A and findings attached as Exhibit B.

Section 3. This order shall take effect immediately upon approval.
