Appeal Procedures

Eligibility to appeal this amendment is governed by ORS 197.612, ORS 197.620, and ORS 197.830. Under ORS 197.830(9), a notice of intent to appeal a land use decision to LUBA must be filed no later than 21 days after the date the decision sought to be reviewed became final. If you have questions about the date the decision became final, please contact the jurisdiction that adopted the amendment.

A notice of intent to appeal must be served upon the local government and others who received written notice of the final decision from the local government. The notice of intent to appeal must be served and filed in the form and manner prescribed by LUBA, (OAR chapter 661, division 10).

If the amendment is not appealed, it will be deemed acknowledged as set forth in ORS 197.625(1)(a). Please call LUBA at 503-373-1265, if you have questions about appeal procedures.

ORDINANCE NO. 2588

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKE OSWEGO AMENDING THE LAKE OSWEGO COMPREHENSIVE PLAN MAP AND ZONING MAP TO REMOVE A 2.3-ACRE RESOURCE CONSERVATION (RC) OVERLAY DISTRICT DESIGNATION FROM 18 PROPERTIES. (LU 12-0011- $\frac{1}{1}$ 82) 1791)

WHEREAS, the City initiated an amendment to the Lake Oswego Comprehensive Plan Map and Zoning Map to remove a 2.3-acre Resource Conservation (RC) Overlay District designation from 18 properties, as shown on the map in Attachment A; and

WHEREAS, the City followed the requirements of LOC 50.07.004.8.b.iii in processing the removal application in the same manner as a designation application, as a quasi-judicial Comprehensive Plan Map and Zoning Map amendment; and

WHEREAS, notice of the public hearings relating to consideration of this Ordinance was duly given in the manner required by law; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held before the Lake Oswego Planning Commission on April 23rd, 2012 at which the staff report, testimony, and evidence were received and considered; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission deliberated, adopted findings of fact and conclusions, and recommended that LU 12-0011 be approved by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held before the City Council of the City of Lake Oswego on June 5th, 2012 at which the staff report, testimony, and evidence were received and considered;

The City of Lake Oswego ordains as follows:

Section 1. In support of this ordinance, the City Council adopts the Findings and Conclusions stated in Attachment C;

Section 2. The Lake Oswego Comprehensive Plan Map and Zoning Map are hereby amended to remove a 2.3-acre Resource Conservation (RC) Overlay District designation from the 18 properties identified in Attachment B, as shown on the map in Attachment A.



15	Commission to amend the Comprehensive Plan Map and Zoning Map to remove a 2.3 acre

17	include portions of tree grove TG-17. LOC 50.07.004.8.b.i(2) allows removal of an Overlay

21	the resource and a re-application of the ESEE analysis demonstrates that the designation no							
22	longer meets the criteria.LOC 50.07.004.8.a.iii(2) provides that, to qualify for an RC Overlay							
23	District designation, a resource must meet the requirements of LOC 50.07.004.8.a.vi, and an							
24	Economic, Social, Environmental, and Energy (ESEE) Analysis must show that the resource is							
25	required to be protected.

LOC 50.07.004.8.a.vi states that a tree grove may be placed within an RC Overlay District if it has:

- (1) A HAS [Habitat Assessment Score] ranking of at least 35; or
- (2) A "high" ranking for scenic values in the study; or
- (3) Is associated with a stream corridor or wetland that has an RP ranking.

TG-17 was evaluated in 1994 and received a HAS ranking of 33. It nevertheless was designated based upon a conclusion that it had high scenic value. However, this rating was a mistake. It is inconsistent with the data recorded in the supplemental field ratings worksheet.

The Resources Areas Report states that a resource is considered to have high scenic value if it ranks "high" in at least one of the following three categories and "medium" or higher in at least one additional category:

- a. Unusual or particularly attractive vegetation or feature(s)
- b. High visibility for a large number of people
- c. Screening value (e.g., incompatible or unsightly land uses)

TG-17 received "medium" rankings in all three categories, insufficient for a high scenic value rating.

A reapplication of the ESEE analysis demonstrates that TG-17 does not meet the required significance criteria.

Based upon the foregoing, the City Council finds that, because there was a mistake in the analysis of quality or quantity in the original designation of TG-17 as being within an RC Overlay District, and because a reapplication of the ESEE analysis demonstrates that the designation does not meet the criteria, the RC Overlay District designation for TG-17 should be removed.

Page 3 - FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS (LU 12-0011-1791)

CONCLUSION

The City Council concludes that LU 12-0011-1791 complies with all applicable criteria and should be granted. The City Council also concludes that proposed Ordinance 2588, amending the Comprehensive Plan Map and Zoning Map to remove the RC Resource Overlay Designation from the 18 properties within TG-17, should be enacted.
