Peru: March 11th to June 30th, nearly 1,200 women disappeared Specialized Courts in Guatemala: 12 courts catered towards issues of D.V and other crimes

Significant increase in women protected through these courts

The US should implement specialized Immigration Courts catered towards D.V victims

reported domestic abuse to law enforcement & were not protected.

40% of women didn't report abuse due to law enforcement's lack of protection
