## The Stockard-Johnson Measure of Sex Differences

This measure was originally developed in 1973 by Professors Stockard and Johnson. Results from the scale are reported in the following articles: "Expressiveness Re-evaluated," Miriam Johnson, Jean Stockard, Joan Acker, and Claudeen Nafziger, *School Review*, 83 (August, 1975) pp. 617-644; "Measuring Gender Differences: The Expressive Dimension and the Critique of Androgyny Scales," Sandra Gill, Jean Stockard, Miriam Johnson, and Suzanne Williams, *Sex Roles*, 17 (October, 1987), pp. 375-400; and "Gender Roles and Behavior in Social Dilemmas: Are There Sex Differences in Cooperation and Its Justification?" Jean Stockard, Alphons J. C. van de Kragt, and Patricia J. Dodge, *Social Psychology Quarterly* 51 (Spring, 1988), pp. 154-163. Information on reliability is given in the 1987 article. The authors assert that construct validity was demonstrated with the consistent replication of results and the congruence of the scales and social theory. Additional evidence of construct validity are available in Anne M. Murtagh (1993).
