ERA is a digital repository of research output from members of the University of Edinburgh. Contained within the repository are full-text digital Theses and Dissertations, book chapters, journal



pre-prints and peer-reviewed journal reprints. Currently we have http://www.era.lib.ed.ac.uk/ over 300+ full-text items that are accessible.

Our goal is to provide free and full access to the published and peer-reviewed research output of scholars, scientists and researchers here at the University of Edinburgh.

By depositing research material into this service, scholars will get wider access to and gain higher impact for their own research material. "free and full access to research output"
